### WHAT GOING GREEN!

According to Pennsylvania State guidance all organizations opening for the first time in the green phase must operate at 50% capacity.

### NOTES discussion highlights

#### Procedures and Accommodations for Staff, Volunteers, and Patrons

- Complete an inventory of all spaces (behind-thescenes, public, etc.) to assess your capacity
- Stagger work schedules to reduce contact
- Follow CDC and State guidance for PPE
- Use physical barriers for high traffic areas
- Provide options for timed entry
- Post signage for social distancing and one-way directions
- Tell people what to expect
  - For staff and volunteers operational accommodations and expectations
  - For patrons ease concerns by providing expectations for their visit (masks, temperature monitoring, etc.)
- Consider other accommodations when requested.

#### Insurance and Liability

- Have your attorney review your insurance clauses to determine coverage
- Business Interruption and Civil Authority clauses are the most common insurance claims being submitted at this time. While most claims will be denied, if legislation changes having a claim on record will be beneficial.
- The risk of liability is low if your organization is abiding by CDC and State guidance
- Consider added protections such as release forms
